

Prior Authorization Information For Your Patient's Medicaid Pharmacy Benefit

We want to make it easy for you to determine which medications require prior authorization for your patients who are UnitedHealthcare Community Plan members.

Check if prior authorization is required.

Follow these steps to view a PDF of a Preferred Drug List.

- 1 Go to UHCprovider.com and click **Menu** in the top left corner.
- 2 Select **Health Plans by State** from the drop-down menu and choose your state.
- 3 Click **Medicaid (Community Plan)** then **View Offered Plan Information**.
- 4 Click on **Pharmacy Resources & Physician Administered Drugs**.
- 5 Click the "+" to expand Prescription Drug/Formulary Lists, Drug Search and Updates.
- 6 Choose the **Preferred Drug List** for the member's health plan.

If prior authorization is required:

Submit the following: **Provider information**, including fax number and National Provider Identifier (NPI)

Member information

Drug information, including the medication name, dosing information and directions for use

Diagnosis the medication is intended to treat

Pertinent clinical notes including progress notes, lab results and any additional information you would like us to consider when evaluating whether the medication is medically necessary

Using one of these:

- 1 Use covermymeds.com. Log in or click "create a free account" in the top right corner.
- 2 Use **PreCheck MyScript**. Go to UHCprovider.com/pcms to get started.
- 3 **Call the Pharmacy Prior Authorization Service at 800-310-6826**. Certain medications require specific documentation that can't be submitted by phone. These may include opioids, hepatitis C medications, growth hormone, Synagis and Enoxaparin (Lovenox).
- 4 **Fax us a Pharmacy Prior Authorization Form**. Be sure to use the prior authorization form for your state and the specific drug you're prescribing. The forms are listed by state and then drug name or drug classes in alphabetical order. To find the form for your state, go to UHCprovider.com > **Prior Authorization and Notification > Clinical Pharmacy and Specialty Drugs > Community Plan Pharmacy**.
